Jazz in the Pines is located at the end of Tollgate Road on the Idyllwild Arts campus in the cool, clean air of the breathtakingly beautiful mountain village of Idyllwild, California. All parking is free with shuttles running continuously between the center of town and clearly designated lots. Beer, wine by the glass or bottle, premium wine tasting, margaritas and food concessions are all available for sale on the Jazz in the Pines grounds. Endowment Funds represent hope for the future – the future of the Associates and the future of our incredibly talented students. This year our contribution to scholarships from the Associates Endowment was the third largest amount after our donation from the Jazz Festival and that of memberships. As our Endowment grows, it has the potential to become an even larger component of our giving to the Idyllwild Arts scholarship fund, so please consider donating to the future of the Associates and the future of our students.

Our Endowment Fund was established in 1988 by some very forward thinking Associate members. It grew from then

until 2003 primarily through donations some of which were in memory of former active Associate members. In 2003 we started including 10% of the proceeds of Associate-sponsored events so the Endowment could grow faster and provide larger amounts toward the scholarships for students. Since 2003 the fund has doubled in size.

At the present time our fund has over \$165,000. While the current economic situation in the world has had some effect on the Associates Endowment Fund, our conservative investment approach has helped reduce that impact compared to many other investment strategies. (Cont from pg 1) student scholarships. This year we earned \$7,437 and because the inflation rate is low we were able to donate \$5,798 to the IAF for student scholarships (the largest donation the endowment has ever made).

The Fund accepts cash, stock, bonds, real estate and other assets. This is an opportunity to memorialize a friend or family member or make a bequest through your own will or living trust. Donations can be designated for specific categories such as the summer program, local students, or music students. A percentage of our contributions go to local students.
